

GARRY WILLIAMS
CLASS OF 2004

Garry Williams played defensive tackle for the Seneca Red Hawks and the football team competed in the playoffs each year that Williams played. In his senior year, he was named a 2003 first-team all-state player by the AP and the Courier Journal after leading his team to a 10-2 record and the second round of the state playoff. The team reached number #1 in the rankings, for the first time, during his senior year. Williams also was on the Track and Field team and he was ranked second in the state in shot put in 2003.

He enrolled at the University of Kentucky in 2005 and in his first season of football played in five games before starting in the final three games of the season at left tackle. As a senior, Williams was named to the All-SEC second team and the Outstanding Offensive Lineman. He finished his career at Kentucky playing in 45 games and starting in 39 of the contests.

Williams went undrafted in the 2009 NFL draft but went on to be the only undrafted rookie to make the active roster of the Carolina Panthers. Williams dealt with repeated injuries while playing for the Carolina Panthers. In 2012 he played a complete season and contributed to a team record 29 first downs in a single game.

In 2015 he signed and played with the Calgary Stampeders. On August 4, 2016 he signed with the Chicago Bears as an offensive tackle and is on the active roster as of this writing.
